## How is my child supported at Heath Lane Academy?

Your child will have a form tutor, and your child will have a Pastoral Leader who will have met them on their visit to their primary school and also during transition. The Pastoral Leader will get to know your child well and will provide support where needed for both academic or pastoral needs. Pupils will also have a form tutor who will see them daily with their form group. We promote good attendance, punctuality, high standards of behaviour and uniform as we know this provides the conditions which enable all pupils to be successful. We use a system called Arbor, a mobile app that is perfect for keeping the whole-school community up to date. We regularly message parents so you are fully aware of everything you need to know.

## What do Heath Lane Academy do to support the transition from primary to secondary school?

We believe that pupils need to feel at home in their school environment. Once they do, we find they settle quickly and can start to take full advantage of the opportunities on offer. That's why we offer a two-day transition experience from 2nd to 3rd July 2026 from 8.45am-2.50pm both days. We want your child to become familiar with our school, enjoy a wide range of lessons, and feel confident about the new academic year before the start of the summer holidays. Activities include:

- Getting to know other Year 7 pupils, older pupils, and HLA staff
- Becoming familiar with the school, where the classrooms are, and where lessons take place
- Where key places are, e.g., first aid, the library, the office, and the lecture theatre
- Experience new subjects and lessons
- Know what to do if the fire alarm rings and where to go
- The routines and expectations of Heath Lane Academy
- Practical lessons like Food Technology and PE
- Beginning learning in all your subjects

## School curriculum

The curriculum we offer is designed to develop your child and extend their learning. Unlike primary school, your child will have a timetable of lessons that involves them moving around and carrying their lesson items in their hands as they have different teachers and classrooms. We find this builds independence and responsibility, as pupils learn to manage their time and arrive punctually. At Heath Lane Academy, we have a knowledge-based curriculum, and set high expectations from the very start of Year 7. In order to be successful, we believe that pupils need to learn key facts and processes for each subject, so they have a secure base to build their learning upon.

Your child will be given a Knowledge Organiser for each subject with these key facts on. We use these to set homework, so you can see exactly what they need to know, and can support them in their learning. We believe that knowledge is key to success and are confident that you will soon see the difference that this approach makes for your child.



## Will my child get lost in a big school?

We know that many children worry about getting lost, so we do everything we can to help your child familiarise themselves with their new environment and settle quickly. We use some of the older pupils to accompany new pupils to classes until they are confident in making their way around the school. If they do get lost, members of staff are always around to point them in the right direction.

## What is the food like?

Our food is awesome! Our canteen offers a variety of food options during the school day. We have a reputation for excellent home cooking - all our food is cooked on the day using fresh ingredients. We cater for special dietary requirements and include a wide range of dishes from traditional to international.

Our school uses a 'cashless' cafeteria system - money for food is prepaid, and the children use their finger through a technique called biometrics to debit money as they buy food. We find that this system works very well and prevents the need for carrying cash. If your child currently qualifies for free school meals, this is taken care of through the same system. Of course, your child can bring a packed lunch if they prefer and eat this in the canteen.

## Getting to know your child

During the summer term, staff from Heath Lane Academy will be visiting all our primary partner schools to find out key information about each child. This information ranges from who they are good friends with to any special education or learning needs we need to be aware of. We have a team of staff who support pupils in classrooms and also with any medical issues they may have, again to ensure a smooth transition. You will also have a number of forms we will need you to sign which include medical information, emergency contact details, and safe use of ICT to name a few. These will be given to you towards the end of term. The forms and the information provided is kept confidential and are designed to keep your child safe.



## Can I come for a visit to Heath Lane Academy?

Absolutely! We are always happy to meet parents and carers. If you can arrange it around your commitments, we'd always recommend coming to visit during the school day – we are very proud of our school and would love to show you around whilst lessons are in progress. Even if you have visited the school before, you are very welcome to revisit.
